# **Enrolment Policy**

# PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to specify entry eligibility criteria for students seeking to participate in Drouin Secondary College's flexible learning option, offered at Blackwood Bratauloong Centre for Adolescent Development (Blackwood).

# POLICY

#### About Blackwood

Blackwood is a standalone, specialist campus of Drouin Secondary College that provides a flexible learning option to support students who are at high risk of disengaging, or are already disengaged, from education. The flexible learning option offers highly individualised learning and has a strong focus on providing holistic support for a student's engagement and wellbeing.

Participation in our flexible learning option is a short-term intervention for students whose needs cannot be met in a mainstream setting, with a focus on supporting the student to return to either a mainstream setting and/or further training or employment. Upon completion of the student's time with Blackwood, it is the responsibility of the referring school to continue supporting the student, either through returning to the school or by supporting or further training or employment.

We welcome eligible students from the time they are in year 7 up until the time they turn 18 (unless the Minister or delegate grants an exemption from the maximum school age requirements – refer to <u>School age requirements and exemptions</u>).

#### **Eligibility criteria**

Blackwood's eligibility criteria is outlined in the Department of Education and Training's <u>Flexible Learning Options</u> (<u>FLOs</u>) policy.

In addition, students seeking to participate must:

- agree to attend and participate in the intervention program
- be best suited to a flexible educational program with additional youth support
- attend a school in the <u>Inner Gippsland Area</u>, as defined by the Secretary of the Department of Education and Training and subject to change from time-to-time

When our flexible learning option has insufficient places to meet demand, the principal or delegate of Drouin Secondary College, in consultation with the region, will consider referrals based on:

- 1. an assessment of educational needs and risk
- 2. whether there or any other suitable educational options available to the student
- 3. ensuring a balance of year levels, student ages, gender and schools participating at the time
- 4. students who attend a school in the *West Gippsland Network*, as defined by the Secretary of the Department of Education and Training and subject to change from time-to-time.

Applications from students who do not meet the eligibility criteria will be considered on a case-by-case basis by the region, in consultation with both the principal of Drouin Secondary College and the principal of the school the

student is enrolled.

#### **Referral and approval process**

The referral and approval process for entry to our flexible learning program is outlined in the <u>Student referrals to</u> <u>Flexible Learning Options guidance</u> in the Department's Flexible Learning Options (FLOs) Policy.

All referrals must be made through the online referral approval system for local area approver or regional director approval.

When a student is referred to, and participates in, the Blackwood program the student will remain enrolled at their home school with the intention of returning at the end of the program, better equipped to manage within the school environment and/or further training or employment.

#### **Appeal process**

Parents/carers are able to appeal against the decision not to provide entry, unless a decision has already been made by the Regional Director. This can occur in relation to placements at any age level and the following process applies:

#### 1. Appeal to the school's Principal

Appeals are to be made in writing and lodged with the Principal of Drouin Secondary College.

The school's decision will be communicated to the parent/carer in writing. In assessing the appeal, the school will check to ensure the entry decision is consistent with the eligibility criteria set out in this policy and any other factors that may be relevant to the decision.

#### 2. Appeal to the Regional Director

If the appeal at the school level is unsuccessful and parents/carers are not satisfied that their appeal has been adequately considered, they are able to escalate this by lodging an appeal in writing to: Regional Director, South-Eastern Victoria Region PO Box 5, Dandenong, VIC 3175 <u>sevr@education.vic.gov.au</u>
