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## YEAR 102024

- As of 2024, students will no longer be in levels but will be Year 10 students in Year 10 Classes (eg: Year 10 English, Year 10 Mathematics no more 400 Mathematics)
- The Year 10 program combines core subjects that ensure students maintain a broad range of pathway options, with allowing students to begin to specialise and accelerate in specific areas of interest in preparation for their continued education through to Year 12 and beyond.
- Mathematics, English, Science, Humanities and Health / Physical Education are compulsory
- Year 10 is primarily an elective based program. Year 10 students are encouraged to undertake a VCE accelerated subject, as it offers a valuable insight into the VCE experience and prepares them for a full VCE or VCE Vocational Major program in subsequent years

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## MAINSTREAM YEAR 10 PROGRAM

## Year 10 Core Subjects

All Year 10 students will undertake the CORE subjects over the course of the year. English and Mathematics will run all year whilst Health/PE, Humanities and Science run on a semester basis.

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## YEAR 10 VET PROGRAM

## Year 10 VET Program

A VET course of study provides students with the opportunity to explore an area of interest whilst developing general work-related competencies and the skills required for a particular industry. Students must complete the VET Expression of Interest Form and meet the criteria as set in the expression form.

| Core Subjects | $1 \times$ VET Subject | $3 \times$ Electives |

- Nationally approved, certificate-based program
- There are two levels of VET certificate: Certificate II, Certificate III
- Certificates are completed over one or two years
- Students can commence Year 10 with VET and in the following year (Year 11) choose to: Complete VCE and VET concurrently OR Complete VCE VM/ VET

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## VET INFORMATION

VET Courses are currently run by: Drouin Secondary College, TAFE Gippsland, CCG, AGA, other Secondary Colleges and some Private Colleges

In 2024, DSC will offer 3 VET Courses on site

- Hospitality (Certificate II)
- Sport and Recreation (Certificate III)
- Building \& Construction (Certificate II)

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## VET CRITERIA

- Students must obtain a USI
- Students must submit an Expression of Interest Form
- Students must have a Progress Score of above 65\%
- Students must have an attendance of $85 \%$

All VET Applicants will have a case by case review.

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## YEAR 10 APPLIED \& VOCATIONAL PATHWAY

Year 10 Applied \& Vocational Pathway
This pathway is designed for students who are considering the VCE Vocational Major (VCE-VM) or a vocational pathway afterschool. This program is an applied learning program where students if it is appropriate for them will be able to complete a VET course of their choice and a possible work placement.

Further information will be released regarding the criteria and application after Course Counselling.

If you are considering this option- you must book an appointment for Course Counselling and select a normal course and fill in an Expression of Interest Form and sign it with your parents.
